

Cherokee County School District provided work-based learning opportunities for 523 students in 827 businesses throughout Cherokee and surrounding counties in the 2008-09 school year. These students clocked in a total of 169,325 hours earning income totaling \$1,162,404.

Cherokee County School District employs five Career Pathway Facilitators (CPF) to coordinate all work-based learning opportunities for high school students. The lead facilitator works closely with county personnel and peer facilitators to ensure collaborative and system wide cohesion of all work-based learning.

Each CPF works with Career Technical and Agricultural Education staff and feeder schools to promote all aspects of Career Related Education, including work-based learning. CPFs actively serve on local advisory boards, Cherokee Chamber of Commerce Workforce Development, Cobb-Cherokee Department of Labor and various business associations throughout the county. Facilitators worked with Appalachian Technical College in coordinating the assessment of 418 seniors throughout the county in the Georgia Work Ready Assessment.

Facilitators actively disseminate career awareness information to faculty and students. CPFs were responsible for assisting 2,519 high school students in creating electronic career portfolios through the District's licensed, web-based program, Career Cruising.
